Computerization of Indian Courts and its challenges

GENESIS

- Conceptualization of e-Courts Mission Mode Project for ICT enablement of courts
- Part of National eGovernance Plan
- To enhance judicial productivity; make justice delivery system more accessible, cost effective, reliable and transparent
- Implemented jointly by Department of Justice and e-Committee, Supreme Court of India.

CHALLENGES

- Adjudication for vast population requiring huge infrastructure
- 2/3 rd of the population in rural areas
- Diverse socio-economic, cultural and linguistic backgrounds
- Dispersed/ far flung / difficult terrain areas
- Digital divide
- Lack of legal awareness

- 14249 Courts computerised
- Outlay : ₹ 9.35 Billion
- LAN installed in 13683 Courts
- Laptops provided to 14309 Judicial Officers
- VC enabled in 347 Jails and 493 Court Complex
- CIS software version 1.0: 13672 Courts software enabled and 72 Mil. cases on CIS

eCourts Phase II (2015-23): *Citizen Centric e-Services*

- 18735 Courts computerised
- Outlay: ₹ 16.70 Billion
- 2976 Court Complexes out of 2992 (99.4%) connected with WAN
- Solar Energy backup installed in select courts.
- VC enabled in 3240 Jails and 1272 Court Complex
- CIS software version 3.2 based on Free and Open-Source Software implemented in all Courts

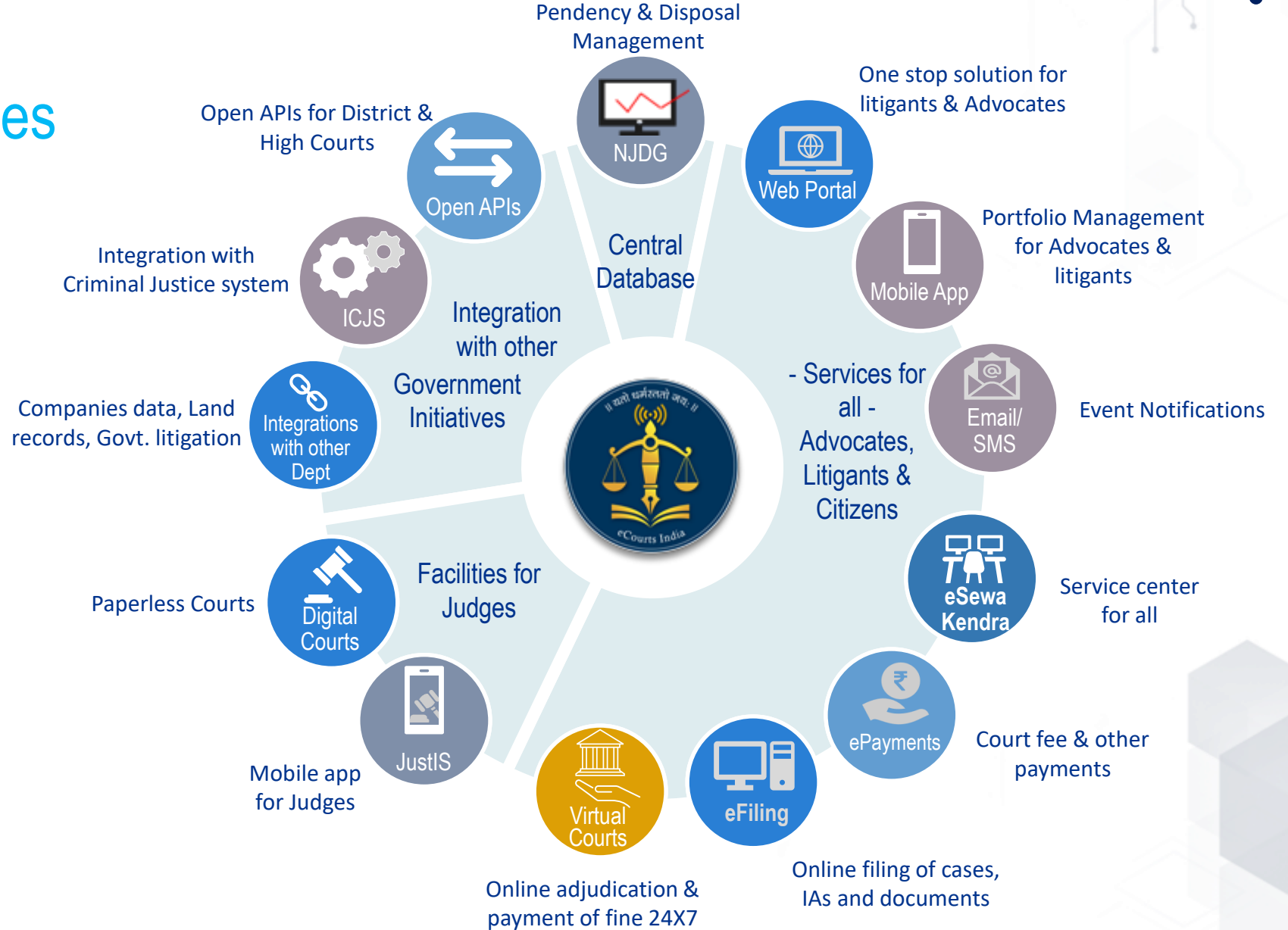

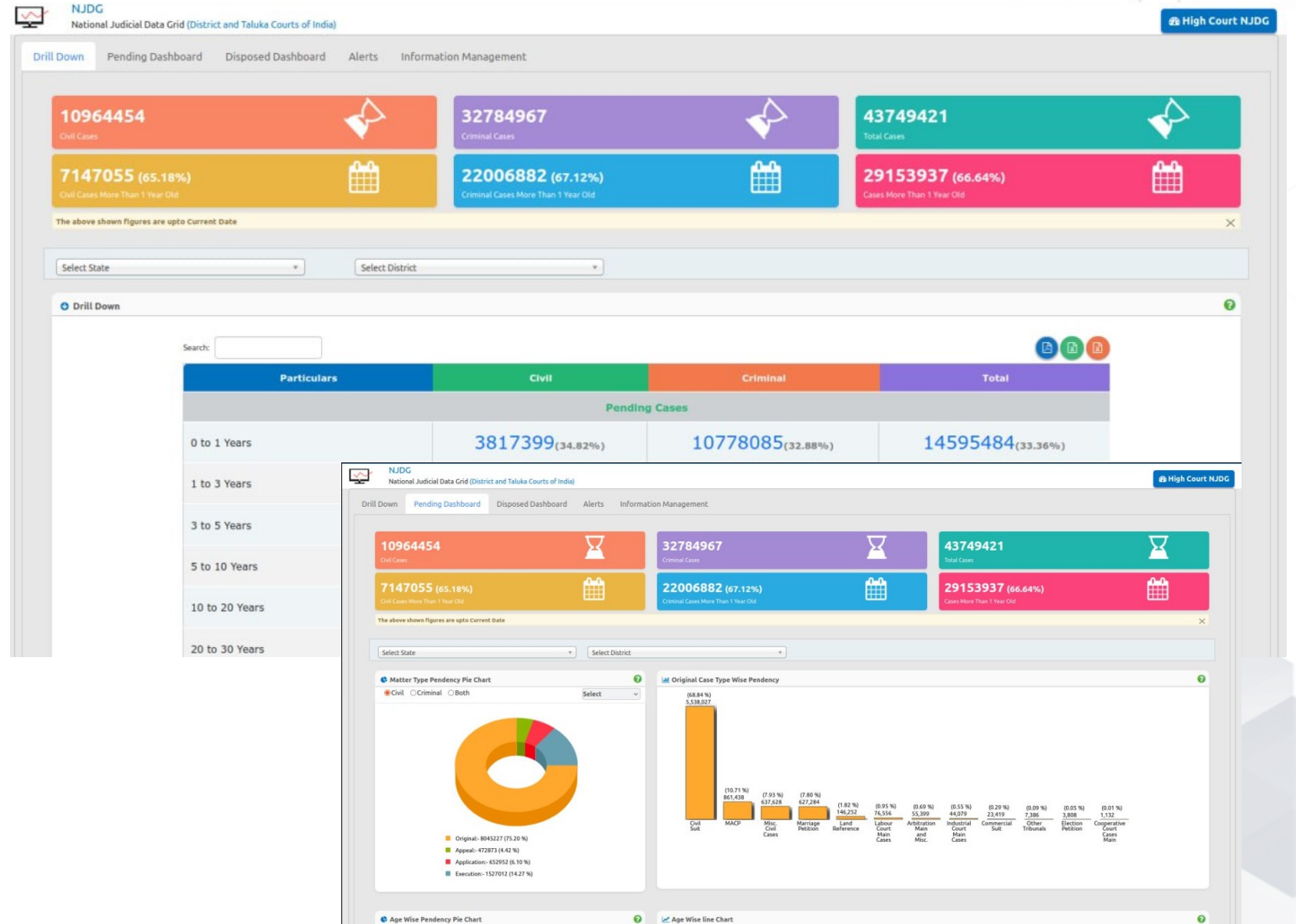

Phase III

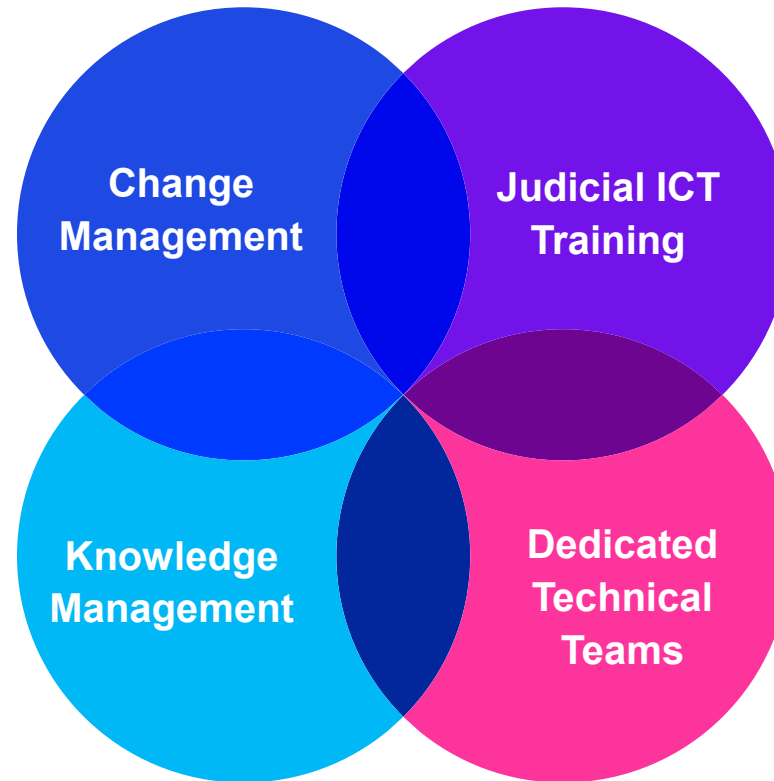

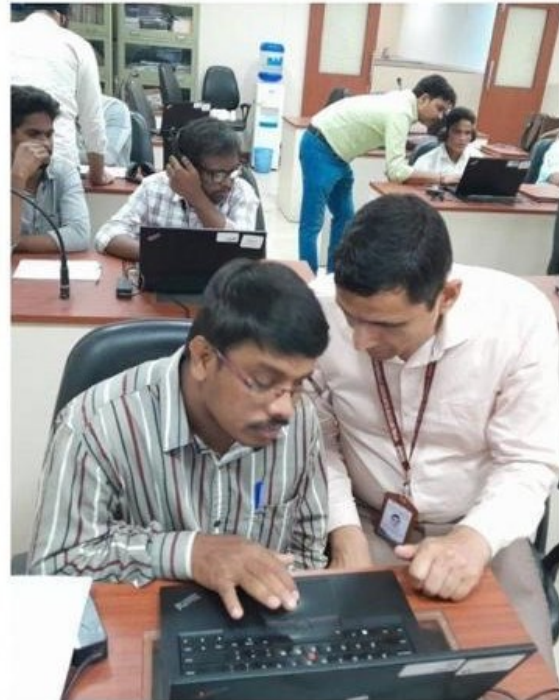
